The celebrations concluded with snacks of Filipino dishes for participants and guests.





Discussed on August 2 was Lesson 1 ---"In the fullness of time" (Galatians 4:4-5 NIV) But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, 5 to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship). The verses describe how God sent His Son when the time was right, born of a woman and under the law, to redeem humanity from the law's bondage and allow people to be adopted as God's children. The passage highlights Jesus's fully human birth and his role in ending the reign of the law, ushering in a new era where believers can have a sonship relationship with God.
