Celebrating Buwan ng Wika

The Child Education and Nutrition Enhancement Program (CENEP) sites in Mandaluyong, Marikina, and Cainta celebrated *Buwan ng Wika* on August 28, 29, and 30, respectively. This year's theme is "Filipino: Wikang Mapagpalaya" (Filipino: The Liberating Language). Celebration of Buwan ng Wika aims to showcase the richness of the Filipino language and deepen the appreciation and understanding of Filipinos of their own language and culture.

Children and staff attended their programs dressed up in Filipino traditional costume. Classrooms were decorated to add a festive atmosphere. In CENEP Cainta, the teachers and parents put together an ice cream cart and a jeepney using cardboards and glue. A favorite was the "pabitin" that made the children's day.









Orienting GEESE Scholars

The 30 scholars of our Grace Enough to Ensure Secondary Education (GEESE) program attended the orientation held at Nemesio I. Yabut Senior High School on August 14, 2024. Also present were their parents and some family members. Officials of the Department of Education (DepEd) Schools Division of Makati City spearheaded the program. Mrs. Emmy Huang, President of the Foundation, talked on the features of the GEESE scholarship, encouraged the scholars to do their best, shared the Foundation's expectation of the scholars' commitment and demeanor, and discussed other conditions in the scholarship agreement. The importance of the parents' involvement in building their children's character was likewise pointed out.
