Busy start of the school year for CENEP



The beginning of each school year for CENEP involves a flurry of activities, with parents' orientation, start-up kits distribution, height and weight validation, and signing of an agreement between parents and the Foundation.

For School Year (SY) 2025-2026, an orientation program was held in each site to inform parents about school rules and their role in supporting their children's educational journey. Key points presented were school values and mission, school rules (discipline, respect, and safety), parent responsibilities, and collaboration between parents and teachers.

The Foundation opened a new CENEP site in Barangay Kabulusan, Pakil, Laguna, in partnership with Christ the King Church – Kabulusan. Some 30 children arrived on the first day of class and were excited to see the newly renovated classroom designed for progressive learning and opportunities for growth and development.

The dedicated school team welcomed the students and explained essential classroom rules to promote respect, responsibility, and safety, as well as daily routines, such as arrival procedures, transitions, and dismissal. Clear objectives were set to ensure a productive and engaging learning environment. The children's enthusiasm, creativity, and energy were immediately evident in their first activity—learning through songs. This was a hands-on application by the Pakil CENEP team of what they learned in their pre-school year Teacher Training Workshop about the value of music as a tool for building community and fostering a love for learning.
